Good morning everyone,

I hope you are all well. Things have gone really smoothly at school this week and it has been lovely to see many more children returning; I just wish that it was all of you. We have had around 77 children attending in main school and 16 per session in preschool this week. On Monday we will be welcoming back some more pupils (Y1 and a small number of pupils who are eligible as key worker children). This will take us up to 95 in main school, 111 in total.

Due to the numbers of pupils who are returning next week we have again had to make some changes to our risk assessment. The changes are to the blue section – daily routines. All other sections remain the same.

I know that you will have just got used to new routines this week and we are changing things again and we do apologise for this; however it is the only way that we can accommodate the pupils with the current restrictions that are in place. We are not planning on admitting any more pupils this term so these arrangements <u>should</u> stay in place from Monday until the end of the term.

Before I get into the details of exactly what next week will look like there are a few things that I need to remind you of; we will need your support with these if things are to run smoothly next week.

- The children will be returning full time unless there are exceptional circumstances and these will be agreed by the Principal or Vice-Principal.
- <u>Punctuality is critical</u>. Children and parents are asked not to enter the site more than 5 minutes before the start of their day but to ensure also that they are not late. The same applies to home time.
- The one way gate system will be strictly adhered to and we must ensure that <u>no cars (parents) enter the school grounds</u> unless this has been agreed beforehand.
- Please ensure that your children only bring essential things into school.
   Children must not bring in toys, especially soft toys.
